



#### STEWARDSHIP Offertory

We are very grateful to all the St. Thomas More parishioners who so generously support our Parish. Below is our weekly report on Offertory collections along with some selected contribution data.

- In the month of May, 488 families or 33.7% of registered families contributed to the offertory.
- May's collections were \$4.6k or 5.4% above the prior year and \$0.1k above budget.
- Cumulatively, our offertory is (4.7%) or (\$54.0k) below budget for the fiscal year through May. We have one month remaining in the fiscal year to address this shortfall.
- Currently 27I families contribute regularly through online giving and we encourage all Parish families to prayerfully consider this important giving option. For information on the Online Giving Program, please visit our Parish website.

Mustard Seed Communities has focused on abandoned children with disabilities primarily because these children are among the most vulnerable and defenseless in any society. Since 1978, MSC has provided care and shelter for children living with varying degrees of disabilities.

#### Children with disabilities are routinely abandoned in the countries where Mustard Seed Communities operates.

The children of MSC have disabilities that include cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, autism, epilepsy, blindness, developmental delays, scoliosis, microcephaly, progeria and others. Our objective is to provide these children with a safe and healthy place to live, where they have care and therapy. MSC's purpose is to advance the moral, mental and physical well being of children with disabilities.

#### Therapy is a key component of caring for children with disabilities.

Our children with physical disabilities are assessed individually. MSC staff then devises a personal care plan with specific goals for each resident. A minimum of one half hour each day is spent in direct one-on-one contact with every resident. The rest of their time is spent on more passive activities such as correct positioning that does not require constant supervision.

Activities in the therapy department include Passive Range of Motion, Active Assisted Range of Motion and Active Range of Motion Exercises, stretching, massages, self-feeding, tactile stimulation, positioning, vestibular stimulation, assisted ambulation, cognitive therapy, coordination and multisensory stimulation.

#### MSC strives to ensure that no person is ever abandoned twice.

In Jamaica, there are no facilities - governmental or otherwise - available to take care of individuals with mental and physical disabilities after the age of 18. The vision for Jacob's Ladder is to fill this void by providing 500 adults with mental and physical disabilities with a home where they can live out their lives in a safe and nurturing environment. Our apostolates that house adult residents aim to provide a place where they can learn skills and apply them directly in their daily lives. Our caregivers work with the residents and help them develop a sense of responsibility.
