From the Pastor's Desk:



RCIA?? Does this ring a bell? The use of acronyms is somewhat passe but still useful. RCIA stands for The Rite Of Christian Initiation of Adults, an official rite of the Roman Catholic Church since 1972.

Some may still remember that the first part of the Mass; i.e. the readings and homily were once called the Mass of the Catechumens. In the early church, the catechumens, those who were in process of becoming Christians were dismissed just before the Offertory. The RCIA revives these ancient customs. The culmination of the Catechumenate was the dramatic service of the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil with the new fire, the blessing of the water, the procession, the litanies, etc. In the RCIA all these rites are renewed, restored, refurbished, culminating in a glorious celebration of conversion.

The RCIA follows a process of journeying through four periods of formation.

First: Pre-Catechumenate or Inquiry this is a time to share personal stories and questions of meaning

Second: Catechumenate—time to deepen faith/conversion within the community through catechesis, fellow-

ship and prayer

Purification and Enlightenment -Third: preparation for Easter sacraments,

spiritual direction

Fourth: Mystagogia - deepening of sacramental life with emphasis on Gospel, Eucharist and works of charity

There are several celebrations during these periods with the whole community sharing in welcoming the new members.

In order to implement this Rite at St. Thomas More, we will need several people to assist in the process-director, sponsors, discussion facilitators, etc. After the first of the year, we will have a meeting of those who wish to help with this exciting program. Please call the office, if you are willing to help.

What a Difference . . .

What a difference, nine years can make.

It was on November 21, 1975 that Father Howley led a group of St. Thomas More parishioners to Kennedy Airport to greet the Pham Phan family at the end of their journey that carried them halfway around the world. It began in Saigon, Viet Nam, then to Fort Chaffee, Arkansas, and finally to our Parish and to Darien. With Mr. Pham, who was 46, were his sons, Hoang 20, and Quynh 17 and nephew, Tran Phuc 19.

Back in Saigon, Mr. Pham was a Chief of Personnel for the Saigon police department, but his baggage was all he had in his new country.

However, our Parish welcomed the Vietnamese family with love. It located housing for them, found jobs, donated furnishings, and provided transportation until the family could get on their feet.

Throughout the years, the Pham family worked hard and took advantage of the educational opportunities here.

Today, the family still lives in that original apartment at 1795 Post Road in Noroton. Mr. Pham is still working for Moore McCormack, now as assistant accounting supervisor. Both sons have graduated from Norwalk Tech and are employed by Pitney-Bowes. His nephew was also graduated from Norwalk Tech and is now working in Texas.

In all of these years, the Pham family has not forgotten the love and kindness shown by the parishioners of St. Thomas More. As thanks, they have donated Nativity figures to our church and have contributed generously to our emergency

Father Post Becomes New Resident Priest



Father Robert Post became St. Thomas More's second resident priest this past summer.

Father Post explained that as a resident priest he will live in the rectory and say masses on weekends at St. Thomas More. At the same time, he will continue to serve as spiritual director of Stamford Catholic High School. The school has a student body of 700 pupils and a faculty of 55 teachers.

Father Post said he "was very pleased with the warm reception" he has received at St. Thomas More. "During the first few masses, it was sort of scary looking out at a lot of people I didn't know," he said. "But every week, I'm feeling more and more at home, and I'm enjoying being in Darien."

Father Post said his special interests are travel, riding his 10-speed bike and indoor jogging. "I keep telling Father Francis, our other resident priest, he ought to try my indoor exercise machine," he said. "It's great because you can avoid cramps, don't have to run in the cold and dark, and if you collapse, you're right beside your bed," he added with a chuckle

A native of the Bronx, Father Post's previous assignment was as associate pastor of St. Mary's Church in Bethel, Conn., for the past year and a half. That was his first assignment after being ordained in 1982.

Previously, he had been a member of the Congregation of Christian Brothers for 26 years. As a brother, he taught Latin, French and Italian. He also served as

Religious Education Program Stresses Service

The most far reaching and involving program in the Parish has begun another season. The Religious Education Program, under the leadership of Mrs. Zita O'Brian, Director, and Mrs. Ann O'Malley, Coordinator K-5, now has over 675 children enrolled.

Most of the attention in the program is always focused around preparation for First Communion in the Spring of the second grade and Confirmation in the Spring of the eighth grade. However, Mrs. O'Brian stresses, Religious Education is an ongoing process and St. Thomas is committed to providing this experience from kindergarten through the end of high school. The Communion Program lasts for two years while the Confirmation preparation is three years. Students who "drop out" during the remaining years lose valuable steps in the process of learning the message of Christ and putting it to practice.

Father Howley, Mrs. O'Brian, and others involved in running the Religious Education Program feel so strongly about the need for continuous involvement each year that they have stated that the students who drop out in the years when they are not preparing for Sacraments will not be eligible to re-enter the CCD Program without a personal evaluation. Another aspect of the involvement the Parish has in the Religious Education Program is the participation of volunteer teachers in the program. This year, nearly eighty individuals have volunteered as teachers and helpers in this Program. Their dedication and commitment of their time is absolutely essential for a successful Religious Education Program.

As a tangible indication of this. a Teachers' Commissioning Service was held on October 28th at the 8:45 Mass.

The photos shown indicate the empha-

sis on service that is the hallmark of this program. Gone are the days of rote memorization of the catechism. Involvement in helping others less fortunate than ourselves is really the essential link between knowledge of Christ's message and forming a loving caring Church community.

Another aspect of the total Religious Education Program is the active Youth Ministry effort. This group is headed by Ms. Andrea Musante. Her chief involvement is with high school students in providing and environment for wholesome dialogue and social activity.

The well publicized special events such as the Autumn Extravaganza, the Mystery Trip, the Halloween Masquerade Party, a Thanksgiving Service Project and the Christmas Party are examples of how the Youth Ministry Program attempts to involve all aspects of young high school students' lives.



St. Thomas More Parish has recently welcomed a new Youth Minister. Miss Andrea Musante. Andrea's involvement as a teenager in the St. Augustine Cathedral Youth Group spurred her interest in this field, and she enrolled in the diocesan program which lead to her certification as a Youth Minister. In addition she has pursued a Religious Studies major at Sacred Heart University. Andrea also brings to her ministry musical and artistic talents.

Four major social events have already taken place for high school participants: a Midsummer Bash, an Olympic Night, an Autumn Extravaganza, and most recently, on October 8th, a Mystery Trip to the Bronx Zoo. Attendance at each of these events ranged from 20 to 50 teenagers.

Recently, sixteen teenagers were selected to be members of a *Youth Board*. They serve as a sounding board for ideas concerning social activities, prayer services, liturgies and service projects. Eventually they will in turn serve as ministers to their peers.

Andrea feels that the involvement of every teenager is essential to the growth of individuals and of the total group. Together they strive to proclaim Jesus' salvific message of the kingdom, share fellowship and perform service for others.

At St. Thomas More Andrea has found a great deal of support, "far beyond any other situation in which I have found myself." She feels there is genuine caring towards the ministered and the ministers and that the parish serves its community in an exemplary fashion.
