

# Yanks Trim White Sox, With Ford Taking Sixth in Row; Braves Top Giants

## BOMBERS WIN, 10-3, TO END FOE'S SKEIN

**Berra Homer and 6-Run 4th Help Snap Victory String of Chicagoans at Six**

CHICAGO, May 17—Someone had to cool off the red-hot White Sox today, so who other than Whitey Ford would the Yankees call upon to do the job? The stylish southpaw handled his assignment so well he merited a shutout instead of the 10-3 verdict that ended the Chicago winning streak at six games.

Two of three throwing errors at shortstop by Phil Rizzuto, who excelled in all other ways, were responsible for the Pale Hose runs, all unearned, of course.

And so Ford, the major league pitcher with the most victories to his credit this year, posted his sixth straight triumph. It was also his sixth straight route-going performance. The pride of Glen Cove, L. I., who has not lost since Sept. 11 of last year, boasts a 1956 earned-run average of 0.83.

Beating the White Sox is a habit with Ford. The portsider has a won-lost record of 15-3 in his dealings with them since he joined the Yankees in 1950.

### Bombers Collect 12 Hits

Casey Stengel, the pilot of the league leaders, subscribes to the theory that a sloppy victory is decidedly preferable to a clean defeat. He was, therefore, quite content with the twelve-hit attack against five Chicago hurlers.

Ford outpitched Jack Harshman, Joe Dahlke, Sandy Consuegra, Morrie Martin and Connie Johnson. Whitey yielded eight hits before a Ladies' Day turnout of 18,082 at Comiskey Park.

Although Yogi Berra's eleventh homer of the season was the highlight of a three-run outburst against Harshman, the loser, in the second, it was the fourth inning that won for the Bombers. They did not do too much bombing in it, but they wound up with six runs.

It all started with Harshman walking Gil McDougald. Elston Howard was safe on an error by Luis Aparicio. A single by Ford—he got another one later—drove in Howard. After Dahlke replaced Harshman, Rizzuto, who matched his three errors with three hits, filled the bases with a perfect bunt.

Billy Martin drew a pass, forcing over a run. Then Mickey Mantle slashed a sizzler to the right of second base. Nellie Fox flagged the ball, making a spectacular stop. He flipped to Aparicio, but Martin, sliding in, howled over the shortstop.

### Skowron Singles Home Pair

Mantle was credited with a hit and two runs were scored as the ball rolled past Aparicio. Bill Skowron subsequently singled in two more.

Chicago took the lead in the first. Fox doubled and reached third after two were out. When Rizzuto threw badly on Sherman Lollar's grounder, Fox counted.

The Scooter was guilty of a second bad toss in the fifth. This set up the Chicagoans' last tallies.

The Yankees almost had two casualties during practice. Johnny Kucks, hurling to the hitters, was plunked on the head by a ball thrown from the stands by an usher. Tom Carroll, working at shortstop, was hit on the cheekbone by a bad-bounce grounder. Neither was hurt.
