There will be four eclipses this year, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, as follows:

I. Total of the Moon, June 3, the Moon rising with the eclipse on. Only the penumbral phase will be visible on the Pacific coast.

The Sun will set more or less eclipsed east of a line from Brownsville, Texas, through Jefferson City, Mo., to Mackinaw City, Mich. Eclipse begins as follows: New York 7.4, Chicago 6:17, Boston 7:12, Charleston, 7:2, New Orleans, 6:37, St. Louis 6:14 p. m.

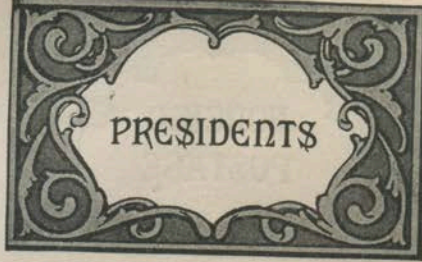
