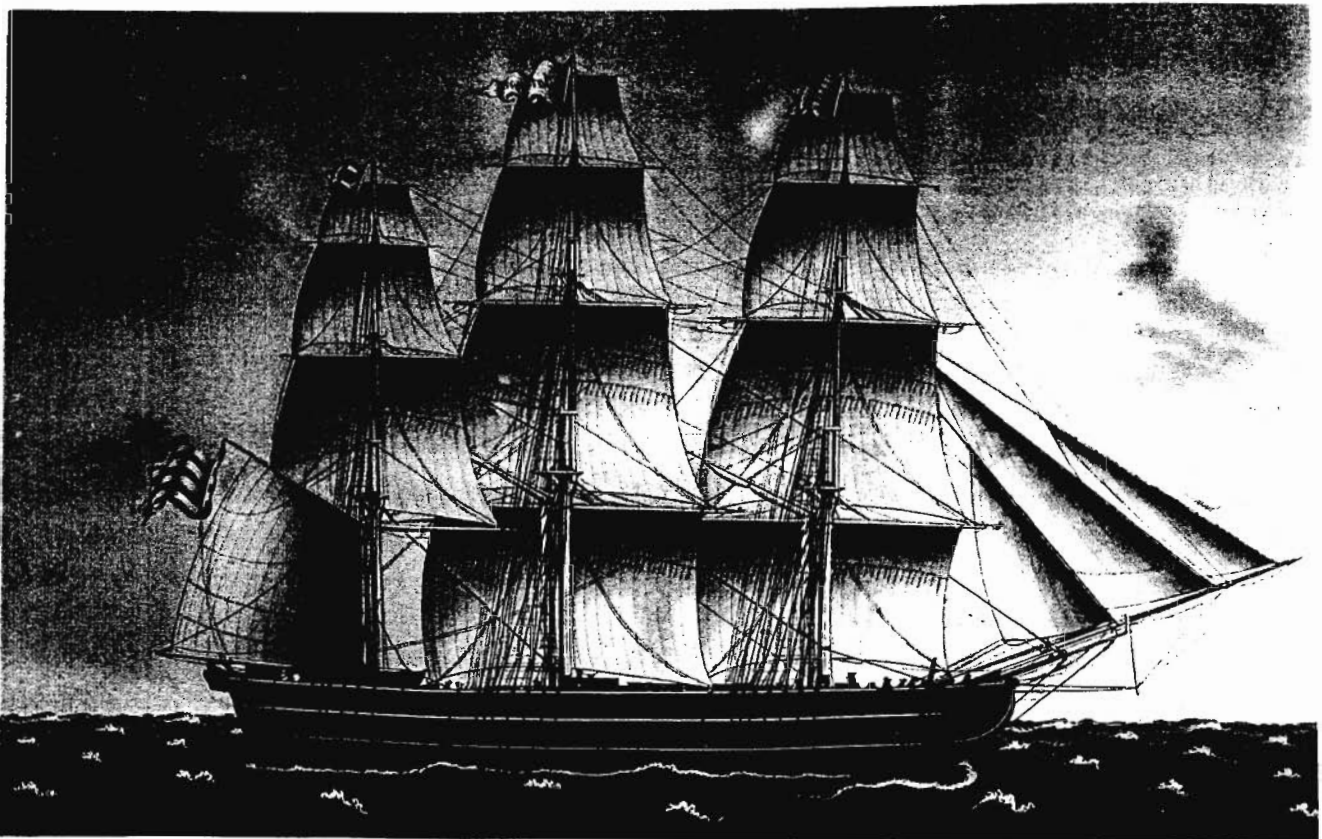

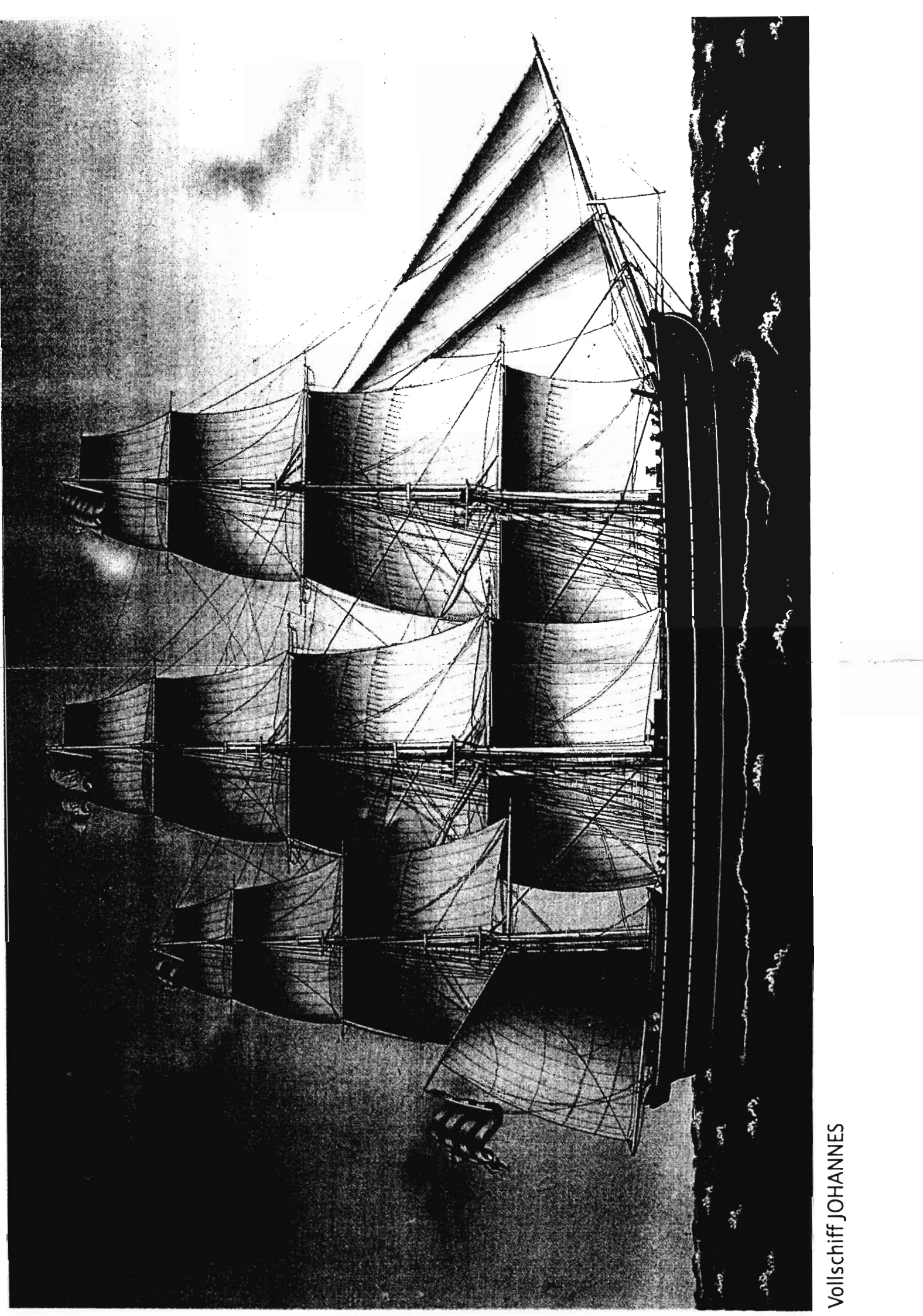

In the spring of 1844 the JOHANNES was lost on a voyage from Bremerhaven to Baltimore. She had left Bremerhaven on March 22, 1844 with 150 passengers and people supposed that she might have hidden an ice mountain in the North Atlantik.
